



Habitus Consulting Collective is looking to recruit temporary bilingual or multi-lingual interviewers for a research project being conducted by Mosaic PCN, Calgary Rural PCN, South Calgary PCN. The purpose of the study is on improving the experience of COVID positive patients impacted by the Cargill meatpacking plant outbreak. The interview will involve talking with individuals who were diagnosed with COVID-19 to understand their experience with the health care system.

This position does not have a guaranteed number of hours as it will be based on language needs of the project. No minimum hours can be assured.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities:**

- Conduct research interviews over the phone or via online modes such as zoom/Google (arrangements not provided by project).
- Each data collector will be expected to take notes during the interview to record the responses.
- Data collectors will be expected to participate in a training around interview methods (compensation provided).
- Complete ethics training at University of Calgary (online brief training).

#### **Timeline:**

- The project timeline will extend from December 2020-February 2021. Interviews will be set up depending on the availability of participants.
- All selected data collectors will be required to attend a training session in December.

#### **Experience and Qualifications:**

- Ability to speak, read and write English fluently (ESL, level 5 or higher) and advanced proficiency in one other language preferably:
  - Tagalog, Spanish, Tigrinya, Oromo, Vietnamese
- (Preferred) for candidate with a master's or above in social science discipline, including course work in qualitative methods
- Knowledge of ethics in social research is required
- Computer literacy with the ability to set up appointments using zoom/google meet.
- Personal phone to set up and conduct interviews (Compensation for phone bills associated with the project will be included).
- (Preferred) Experience in conducting interviews, surveys or stakeholder engagement.
- (Preferred) Experience working with immigrant communities.
- (Preferred) Previous training in research interview skills or conducting surveys.
