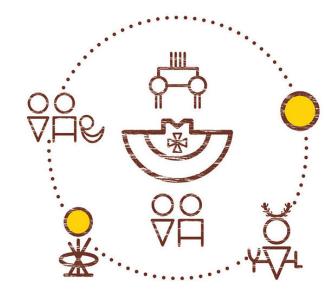

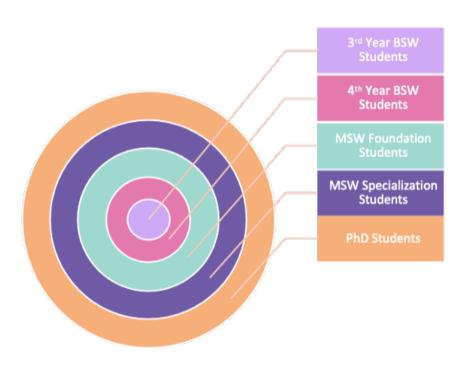

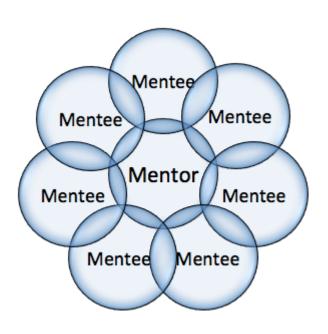

- This diagram demonstrates the reciprocal learning relationships within the near-peer model.
- Program objectives: Foster relationships; Provide psychosocial support for junior students through academic journey and field placements; Enhance working knowledge of social work profession; Nurture the development of leadership and professionalism.
- Guiding principles: Support over guidance, holistic, strengths-based, inter-relational reflexivity, continuous learning.

Goal

 Support challenges of 1st year BSW students entering the program during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Role of the Mentor

 Provide support and guidance during COVID-19 and attending post-secondary education virtually, through peer-to-peer relationships.

Programme Model

- One-to-one mentorship.
- informal, relational & nonhierarchical. Students use multiple online platforms to connect.
