The Transforming the Field Education Landscape: Intersections of Research and Practice in Canadian Social Work Field Education research project, led by Project Director Dr. Julie Drolet, invites applications for several **Student Research Assistant positions in Social Work**. These positions will work remotely from home due to Covid-19. In addition, we are seeking students to fill several positions on the TFEL Advisory Committees (one-year term, 3-5 hours a month): a) Anti-Racism Advisory, b) Green Social Work Advisory, c) TFEL Student Advisory by indicating their interest in the cover letter.

Job Description:

The student research assistants will contribute to "Transforming the Field Education Landscape: Intersections of Research and Practice in Canadian Social Work Field Education" (funded by a SSHRC Partnership Grant) led by Project Director Dr. Julie Drolet. The goal of this partnership is to integrate research and practice in the preparation of the next generation of social workers by developing partnered research training initiatives that enhance student and trainee research practice knowledge and applied skill development. Responsibilities include managing research ethics applications and amendments, contributing to TFEL studies in Canada and Africa, analyzing data, drafting publications and reports, contributing to knowledge mobilization activities (peer-reviewed publications, conference presentations, webinars, workshops, etc.) and other duties as required.

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled in a post-secondary program; preference will be given to applicants registered in an accredited Social Work program in Canada.
- Applicants are required to have relevant practice research and/or field experience and demonstrated capacity to work effectively in a collaborative environment.
- Experience in collaborative teamwork, leadership, and training and mentoring of students is an asset.
